

EQUITY, DIVERSITY, and INCLUSION CONSIDERATIONS for PROJECT PLANNING

When starting a new project, it is essential to consider equity, diversity, and inclusion principles throughout your planning process. The Five Ws below are important questions to ask yourself and your planning committee to ensure that you are including diverse voices, inviting your target audience to participate equitably in the process, and accounting for the diverse accessibility needs of your audience.

Who is/are the audience(s) for this project?
What are the accessibility needs of this audience?
When will you get input from your audience?
Where will you include/account for the family experience in your project?
Why is this approach more likely to benefit than harm your audience?
