
PMHCA and ED Partnership Model

GOALS OF THE PROJECT

- Expand access to psychiatric care for pediatric patients with mental health concerns
- Improve pediatric primary care provider comfort level in treating mental health conditions within their practice
- Expand pediatric practices access to community mental health resources and services

DCPAP SERVICES

DCPAP provides:

- Pediatricians, Family Physicians, Advanced Nurse Practitioners, and Physician Assistants
- With psychiatric consultation to better Diagnose, Treat, and Mitigate mental health conditions for their patients.
- Training and Education to expand their capabilities for treating mild to moderate mental health conditions within their practice.

chiatry Access Pro

Child Psychiatry Consultation Service

- 10 to 20 minute consultation with a Board Certified Child Psychiatrist
- Discuss Diagnosis, Treatment Planning, Medication Management, Screening, and other mental health concerns
- Options will be discussed for consideration in the treatment of the patient
- A summary of the consultation and considerations offered will be provided for the patient record
- Most requests for consultation are answered within a few hours, all within 24 hours

Psychiatry Access Program

COLLABORATIVE CARE PILOT PROJECT

- Initiated in January 2022
- DCPAP working with a Pediatric Practice
- Child Registry management of more than 100 kids
- Child Psychiatry Consultant works directly with Behavioral Health professional within the Practice
- Funded by direct billing of insurance providers
- Initial outcomes look very promising



New PMHCA Collaboration Project Overview



TEAM B is a pilot program that will provide telebehavioral health consultation to emergency departments (EDs) in Washington that care for youth who are "boarding" for behavioral health reasons and have no on-site pediatric mental health specialists.







TEAM B Primary Aims

01

To improve timeliness of mental health care and reduce length of stay for youth boarding in community EDs.

02

To support ED staff in providing more developmentally appropriate and evidence-informed mental healthcare for youth while boarding.










Background Research: Literature


- Scope of problem: national emergency in children's mental health
- Specialty mental health services reduce LOS and improve care for boarding youth
- Telepsychiatry consultation for adults in EDs effective at:
 - Decreasing LOS
 - Reducing unnecessary hospitalizations
 - Lowering cost
 - Outpatient care coordination
- Few studies in pediatric ED telepsychiatry



Implementation Barriers



Pediatric and Perinatal Mental Health Support







Key Components of PPCL

- Statewide, no-cost, provider-to-provider phone consultation
- Just completed integration of pediatric and perinatal programs.
- Operates during regular business hours, from 8am-4:30pm
- Providers register for the program (not required to access consultation)
- Full-time resource and referral support
- Psychiatrists are available for consultation (both synchronous and asynchronous)
- ECHO training series that offer CME's for physicians, nurses, and social workers
- Web site: Clinical tools, handouts, registration form, recorded trainings

PPCL and Expansion to ED's



Learnings and Next Steps

- Appreciated the opportunity to learn from other states
- Connected with EMSC Program
 - EMSC is currently implementing initiative on Pediatric Readiness in ED's
 - EMSC has relationship with ED's across the State
 - Align efforts
- We have some work to do in Louisiana
 - Sort through data what do we have, what do we need
 - Identify key and interested stakeholders and start having conversations
 - Need to build relationships and create momentum
 - Need to know what ED's are wanting and needing Needs Assessment Survey



ED Expansion Next Steps

EMSC State Partner PMHCA Personnel (Capacity) SMART Aim: Program Champions (both Achieve a 50% response rate to ED needs assessment of clinical and administrative) Louisiana's EDs by March 1, 2024. Technical Assistance Technology Global Aim: Establish a meaningful connection between Lousiana PMHCA and Louisiana EDs to expand access to MH/BH resources.

Meet with EMSC state partner to develop strategy to connect with EDs.
Discuss reporting of results and what this will look like.

Dedicate staff time to project.

Define role/scope for personnel.

Engage the following: Hospital associations Hospitals Public health departmental leaders Physicians

Discuss potential avenues for results and future implemenation of other stakeholders.

Meet with key stakeholder groups to develop the needs assessment.






TCAPES-ED Related Project Description

- Received HRSA funding for project in September of 2022
- Leveraged on our existing partnership with the UT-Le Bonheur Psychiatric Specialists from our base-award
- Le Bonheur Children's Hospital ED already received external funds for universal suicide screen but did not have a training component.
- Developed a contract with the Le Bonheur Children's Hospital to provide training for ED staff on suicide screening and improve the follow-up of patients after discharge
- Contract went into effect July 1st 2023










PLAN-DO-STUDY-ACT CYCLE





PLAN/DESIGN

The design for universal screening at the Le-Bonheur Children's ED is to screen <u>all</u> pediatric patients admitted in the ED irrespective of admitting diagnosis.





DO/IMPLEMENT

This design for universal screening has commenced in the Le Bonheur Children's Hospital ED.






STUDY/EVALUATE

Plan is to enact project evaluation throughout the lifespan of the project to determine what works and what does not work.





ACT/ADJUST

Make changes based off data obtained from evaluation







TCAPES-Le Bonheur Children's Hospital ED Project

SMART AIM

Increase the percentage of suicide screening at Le Bonheur Children's Hospital ED from 10% to 90% by June 2025

Decrease the rate of child suicide in Shelby County

About our PMHCA:

• Launch: 2012

- **Funding:** MDHHS, HRSA (in year 5), HRSA expansion funding 2023 expansion to school, **EXPLORE** expansion to emergency settings
- Same-day psychiatry phone consultation for pediatric and perinatal providers in Michigan who treat:
 - Children, adolescents and young adults ages 0-26
 - Perinatal women, up to 12 months postpartum
- Guidance on diagnostic questions, safe medications, and appropriate psychotherapy





Workflow analysis to better integrate screening, care coordination, and MC3 services



Local and regional behavioral health resource and referral navigation



Scheduled educational group case consultation with MC3 psychiatrist



ED Related Project Description

HRSA Objective: Develop, disseminate, and evaluate MC3 consultation and educational programs to select emergency services (ES) programs and clinicians.

Key Activities

- 1. MC3 clinical and program team collaborates with stakeholders, and develops model, criteria, and team for consultations with ES personnel.
- 2. MC3 clinical team disseminates model and provides consultation to select ES programs
- 3. MC3 clinical and program teams develop and implement communication process between ES programs and PCPs.
- 4. MC3 clinical and program teams develop and provide culturally responsive trauma-informed and other education and content for ES professionals.
- 5. MC3 program team evaluates program, implements continuous quality improvement, disseminates results.
- 6. MC3 program team provides technical assistance.



ED Related Project Description

Global Aim: Improve access and care for youth and underserved populations with behavioral health concerns.

Goal: To increase access to child psychiatry expertise in emergency services settings.

<u>Activity 1: MC3</u> clinical and program team collaborates with stakeholders, and develops model, criteria, and team for consultations with ES personnel.

SMART Aim: 100% Development of model, criteria and team for consultation in emergency services setting within 3-6 months of funding.

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

About our PMHCA:Scope of the Problem in Virginia

According to the 2022 Virginia School Survey of Climate and Working Conditions:


- 40% of Virginia high schoolers surveyed felt sad or hopeless almost every day for >=2 weeks in a row.
- 10% of middle school and 13% of high school students indicated that they had seriously considered attempting suicide in the past 12 months.
- Of those, 56% indicated they made a plan about how they would attempt suicide.



About our PMHCA: Scope of the problem


- Virginia ranks 48th lowest in the country when considering prevalence of mental illness in our youth compared to access to care.
 - The State of Mental Health in America, 2023
- Virginia ranks 39th lowest in country for the number of psychiatrists, psychologists, licensed social workers, counselors, therapists and advanced practice nurses specializing in mental health care per population.
 - The State of Mental Health in America, 2023
- Only four counties have sufficient numbers of child and adolescent psychiatrists which represents only 23,086 of the 1.86 million children in Virginia.
 - American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, 2019










How Does VMAP Work?

1,084 providers registered for VMAP




4,109 calls to VMAP line

hours of VMAP training








VMAP QI Project Results:

- 5 months of QI work by 41 providers across the state.
- Approximately 1,000 adolescents per month, with a total of 5,042 adolescents.
- Significant improvement in number of adolescents screened by end of project!






