- If nonprofit status, join local nonprofit management organ
- Network with nonprofits and see where they find funding
- Employer's foundation list (i.e., hospital or university)



Application Tips

- Networking / Relationships
- Don't be afraid to reach out to funders to ask questions before / throughout the process
- Be flexible not all grants fit perfectly with your goals, but tailor your desired program into what funder is looking for
- Pilot programs
- Submit outside requests early (i.e., Letters of Support, financial documents, etc.)
- Have someone outside program to review application to ensure consistency throughout documents
- Be organized!
 - Have a detailed calendar system
 - Keep track of grants
 - Due dates
 - Activities required by grant
