- A widely used rule that reduces CT imaging in children with head trauma
- Definitive guidance for evaluating infants with fever
- Evidence that probiotics do not improve viral acute gastroenteritis
- Definitive guidance on the effectiveness of first-line seizure medications
- A novel tool to screen teenagers for suicidal thoughts and detect mental health needs
- Definitive evidence on the treatment of children with diabetic ketoacidosis (crises)

About

The EMSC Pediatric Emergency Care Applied
Research Network (PECARN) conducts rigorous,
multi-institutional research on preventing and
managing acute illnesses and injuries in children.
PECARN is the first and only federally funded research network
for pediatric emergency care, with a focus on addressing highpriority gaps in clinical knowledge.

Structure

Established in 2001, PECARN is made up of seven research nodes. Six nodes each include three hospital emergency department (ED) affiliates and one emergency medical services (EMS) affiliate, all of which focus on pediatric emergency care across the continuum. The seventh research node has three EMS affiliates and focuses specifically on prehospital care.

What Makes PECARN Unique

PECARN brings together leading physician–scientists across 18 EDs and 9 EMS agencies in 14 states. It leverages a large combined volume of pediatric encounters to conduct meaningful, high–quality research that results in tangible improvements in care. PECARN has received more than \$100 million in research grants, representing a return of \$3 for every \$1 invested.
