### PMHCA Focus Groups + Continued Work

Phase two of the <u>EIIC PMHCA</u> is set to wrap-up in the next few weeks. Teams will continue their discussions, starting with community resources and then moving to legal considerations for engaging EDs. PMHCA awardees participating in the TA development include <u>Michigan</u>, <u>Washington</u>, <u>Delaware</u>, <u>Virginia</u>, <u>Louisiana</u>, <u>Oklahoma</u>, and <u>Tennessee</u>.

EIIC continues to work with teams using these discussions to identify themes for its technical assistance toolkit, with the goal of supporting other PMHCAs in connecting their services with EDs.
