For your awareness, response rate maps will go live soon on the <u>emspedsready.org</u> site. Screenshots are attached. In response to manager feedback, the Data Center made some key changes/enhancements to the map setup:

- Contextual language explaining that assessment response varies by state due to many factors
- A toggle switch shows map and coloring by percent of response and also by number of responses
- No decimals and a blue color palette for easier readability
