The Utah EMSC Program has a goal to have one PECC at each EMS agency

What is a PECC?

A Pediatric Emergency Care Coordinator (PECC) is an EMS provider designated within your EMS agency who ensures that the ambulance service and personnel are prepared to care for ill and injured children.

The PECC does not make decisions on behalf of the agency. Individuals serving as the PECC will have opportunities to work with the Utah EMSC Program, pediatric experts and other agency PECCs in order to get up to date education materials and skills training opportunities.

Who can be a PECC?

What Does a PECC Do?

- Champions for the availability of pediatric medications, equipment, supplies
- Promotes and shares pediatric continuing education opportunities
- Ensures compliance with pediatric clinical practice guidelines and/or protocols
- Oversees pediatric process improvement initiatives
- Serves as the initial point of contact between the Utah EMSC Program and the agency
- Encourages pediatric simulations and hands -on pediatric skills assessment
- Promotes agency participation in prevention efforts and community outreach
- Collaborates with other ED and EMS PECCs
